Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2017-18 educational progress for the Gretchko Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2017-18 school years, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

* Note TSI and ATS definitions were changed for the 2018-19 school year per federal requirements. The new definitions are:

TSI – The school has at least one subgroup performing in the bottom 25% within each applicable accountability index component.

ATS – The school has met the criteria for TSI identification and has at least one subgroup performing at the same level as a CSI school.

Our school was identified as a not needing support and/or improvement. Gretchko Elementary in conjunction with all other elementary schools in the districts are working together to strengthen our Multi-Tiered System of Support to provide interventions, a Comprehensive Literacy Model, accelerate student achievement and close gaps in achievement.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. All students in grades kindergarten through second reside in the West Bloomfield School District or have enrolled in the district under the schools of choice program.

- School Improvement Goals were developed at the end of the 2017-2018 school years in consultation with staff, parents and students. These goals are driven by student achievement data as well. For the 2017-2018 school years, Gretchko will be focusing on mathematics, reading, writing, science, social studies and growing students as quality contributors.

- 4. 92% of students had parent representation at Parent Teacher conferences.
