Did You Know...?

Did you know that globally, 1 out of 7 of us lives with some type of disability? And of those, 80% are invisible. This represents **one billion** people living with a non-visible disability. *Source: Hidden Disabilities* According to the CDC (10/28/2022), 61 million adults live with some type of a disability (visible or non-visble) in the United States, this is 1 out of 4. Just because you don't see it, doesn't mean that it is not there. Non-visible disabilities includes illness or disease that impacts a person's day to day life, just as visible disabilities do. The JAN Network (Job Accomodations Network) creates a paradigm for normalcy of disability, as evident by the data, most people will experience some form of disability or a disability during their lifetime.
