Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Gretchko Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Our school was identified as not needing support and/or improvement. Gretchko Elementary in conjunction with all other elementary schools in the district are working together to strengthen our reading, phonics and writing curriculum by adopting a new program and working to accelerate student achievement and close gaps.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

- All students in grades kindergarten through second reside in the West Bloomfield School District or have enrolled in the district under the schools of choice program.
- 2. School Improvement goals were developed at the end of the 2020-2021 school year in consultation with staff, parents and students. These goals are driven by student achievement data as well. For the 2021-2022 school year, Gretchko will be focusing on mathematics, reading, writing, science, social studies and growing students as quality contributors.
- 3. Gretchko Elementary is a kindergarten through second grade school. It has a special education "leveled" classroom. Art, music, physical education and media skills are taught.

- 5. The table below shows the percentage of students who met or exceeded their expected growth target on NWEA in the spring of 2021. Due to the pandemic shutdown, we did not give NWEA in the spring of 2020.
