IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As increased security measures are put in place, it has become necessary to adjust some of our drop off and pick up procedures.

As always, safety is a primary concern to all of us. Please drop off and pick up students during the allotted time (9:00 a.m. - 9:14 a.m.). Students should be in the classroom and ready to learn by 9:15 a.m. When students are late is very interruptive to our school and the responsibilities of each student and staff member. Staff members all have additional responsibilities beginning at 9:15 a.m when school begins.

If you must arrive late, please park your car in the parking lot, walk your student to the front (left,west) door. You must sign in your student and wait with your child to be buzzed in.

We are no longer allowing parents to drop late students at the classroom door. If you must pick up a student before regular dismissal time, you must call the office for directions (248) 865-6570. You will park in a parking space, come to the front entrance, provide identification, sign

your child out and wait for your child to be brought to you. **No pick up will be from the** classroom door.

Please do not park in our lot or other locations to circumvent the car line.

Review the drop off and pick up traffic pattern on the map below.

Car loop parents please plan to drop your child between 9:00 a.m. - 9:10 a.m. Students will need to be in class and ready to learn at 9:15 a.m. Dismissal begins at 4:07 p.m. We provided large name tags in your "Meet and Greet" packet. Please use the name tag in your windshield when picking up students. Please be sure the name of the teacher is on the sign to help us during dismissal.

For the good of all students, parents and staff members please review and follow this partial list of general safety procedures in place at Gretchko.

- All doors to the school will be locked throughout the school day.
- Drop off and pick up will circle toward the west side of the building.
- Please do not drop off children in the front loop.
- Late students, parents must park in the parking lot, walk their student to the front door, sign in and wait to have the child buzzed in.
- Please do not park in **VIP** designated spots, they have been purchased by parents
- At the time of this printing, adults and students are required to wear a face covering in the building.
- Adults picking up students during the school day, must park in the parking lot, call the
 office for directions.
- Parents, please **notify in advance and in writing any changes to their student's school transportation** pattern. Call the office for emergency pick up(248-865-6570).
- Adult staff will supervise the students going to the busses.
- Please follow directions of our adult staff at the car loop during designated drop-off and pick-up times.
- Students **living in walking distance and have-arranged to walk** will check in with the classroom teacher as long as they are arriving on time.



FOLLOW THESE PROCEDURES WHEN ARRIVING AT THE DESIGNATED DROP/PICK UP TIMES

Please refer to the map below of the school to see where your students' class is located. Locate the proper drop off area. We have 2 arrival and dismissal locations this year.

- * All cars enter the left (West) circle. Remain in the car line through drop off 1, 2.
- *Drop your student at their designated drop off location (See above)
- * All parents should remain in vehicles.

- * Students should unhook their seat belt and open car doors to exit the car.
- * Students will be directed by staff when exiting or entering vehicles.
- * All cars will continue following the car line around the loop.
- * Follow the car line around the building to loop around.
- * Exit on the same side that you entered on the West circle.
- * Please follow arrows and directions from our staff.



TRANSPORTATION CHANGES THROUGH THE SCHOOL DAY

Please have a regular transportation **routine** for your student in place. Changes during the school day are very stressful for all. Any changes in a child's routine transportation "the day of" must be written and received by the school. **We cannot accept any transportation changes after 3:00 p.m. Please do not EMAIL OR LEAVE VOICE MAIL MESSAGES regarding student transportation on the day of the change. Our staff may not receive the message in time regarding the change.**

Preschool parents drop off students in the morning at the same time as our K, 1, 2 students. They are required to go to the left (bus) loop. They may need to pass parents that are already in line to drop off K, 1, 2 students. Your courtesy is appreciated.

FIELD TRIP TO SEE FANTASTIC MR. FOX POSTPONED


Our field trip scheduled for Monday, December 6 and Tuesday, December 7 will be cancelled at this time. It is our intent to revisit the opportunity at a later time.

WE NEED YOUR PROMPTNESS


