
ABOUT WEST BLOOMFIELD



COVID-19 IMPACT

COVID-19 grades have been calculated as follows:

- Students earning below 60% in a course automatically received a CC (COVID Credit) for S2 of the 19/20 school year only.
- Students earning above 60% could 1. Keep the letter grade OR 2. Change the grade to a G (credit only awarded, no impact on overall GPA) for S2 of 19/20 & 20/21 school years.
- Students had the option of attending Lakers Online, 100% virtual learning.
- WBSD has an agreement with Novi Virtual.

High School STEAM Opportunities: WBSD K-12 STEAM instructional initiatives are available at the high school level. STEAM programs employ a Project Based Learning approach and are offered through Project Lead the Way - Engineering.

Project-Based Leaming: WBSD offers hands-on Internship based courses through Professional Apprenticeship, Medical Mentorship, Engineering Academy, Science PBL, Business, and Fine Arts.

One-to-One Technology Devices

Athletic Offerings: 37 Varsity sport offerings. JV and Freshman Teams with sub varsity team available in a number of sports. 122 Seniors earned Scholar-Athlete designation, 42 graduating with a 4.0 or higher. Unified Basketball is offered in tandem with Special Olympics.

DECA: Five students earned the top 10 and 3 students earned the top 20 in the world. Earned Gold recertification for Laker Landing (School-Based Enterprise).

Robotics Team: 2019 & 2021 OCCRA County Champions out of 30 Michigan-based High Schools. Semi-finalists in the FIRST 2022 Season and acted as alliance leaders for FIRST Robotics at districts.

Performing Arts: Seven students performed in the MSVMA All-State Honors Jazz Choir in 2018, 2019, 2020, & 2022.

Partnerships: Henry Ford Hospital, Lawrence Technological University, local physicians, veterinarians, and businesses.

The College and Career Center provides opportunities for students to explore careers, attend college seminars, prepare for the college application process, and participate in an annual on-site admissions day. Students also learn about financial aid and scholarship assistance.
